

WRES Watch D.O.G.S. FAQ's

What are Watch D.O.G.S.?

Fathers, grandfathers, step-fathers, uncles, and other father figures who volunteer to serve at least *one day* a year in a variety of school activities.

Why should I become a Watch D.O.G.S.?

Watch D.O.G.S. provide positive male role models for the students by demonstrating their presence that education is important. Additionally, you will provide extra sets of eyes and ears to enhance school security and reduce bullying.

When can I volunteer to be a Watch D.O.G.S.?

After completing the security background check at Woodmen-Roberts you can access the Watch D.O.G.S. schedule to sign up for a volunteer date. We run the program October - March on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays. A few days before your volunteer date you will receive a friendly reminder email from Sign Up Genius.

Where will I be during my day as a Watch D.O.G.S.?

The day that you come in as a Watch D.O.G.S. you will be filled with many different activities. To start and end the day you will check in at the office. You will start the day in the classroom with your child(ren). Throughout the day you will be patrolling the hallways, engaging with students during recess and lunch and enjoying the academics through other grade levels in the building.
