What are Watch D.O.G.S.?

Fathers, grandfathers, step-fathers, uncles, and other father figures who volunteer to serve at least *one day* a year in a variety of school activities.

Why should I become a Watch D.O.G.S.?

Being a Watch D.O.G. provides positive male role models for the students by demonstrating their presence that education is important. Additionally, you will provide extra sets of eyes and ears to enhance school security and reduce bullying.

When can I volunteer to be a Watch D.O.G.S.?

After completing the security background check at Woodmen Roberts you can access our the Watch D.O.G.S. schedule to sign up for a volunteer date (T-Th). Two days before your volunteer date you will receive a friendly reminder email about where and when to check in.

Where will I be during my day as a Watch D.O.G.S.?

The day that you come in as a Watch D.O.G. will be filled with many different activities. To start and end the day you will be in the classroom with your child(ren). Throughout the day you will be patrolling the hallways, engaging with students during recess and lunch and enjoying the academics through other grade levels in the building.
